A conversation ensued regarding the request for a structural engineer to review the retired sump pump station.

Councilman Weber expressed concerns that no use for building has been established and it will take a lot of work to rehab the building. He stated that we are better off knocking it down and questioned if the contractor doing the work would bring in their own structural engineer.

Councilman Bonnell expressed concerns regarding the money spent on the building and not having a plan for the building. He stated that the structural engineer review should be the responsibility of the contractor and should be included in the bid specs. He stated the DPW could knock the building down and build a pad.

Ms. Barrett stated that the purpose of the structural engineer review is to determine if the building is sound. The cost of knocking the building down and filling in the pumps below would be astronomical. It would also require DEP approval and a CAFRA permit. The plan for the building is to go out to bid which would include specifications requiring a total rehab of the building, a long term lease and credit towards the rent. A new concession at that location would create beach revenue and provide an additional concession/service for the public.

Ms. Schaffer stated that she had prepared the bid specs for the rehab of the building and putting the onus of a structural engineer on bidder may be over reaching and may impact bids being submitted.

Councilman Cotler stated that it would be prudent to have a structural engineer review of the building prior to going out to bid.

perform a structural engineer review of the retired sewer pump station in

an amount not to exceed \$2,500.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilman Weber stated he was pleased with the Strategic Planning meeting. He continued, we had a good turnout for Clean Ocean Action and the Fire Department Fish Fry was a success. He commented that Arye Janoff would be an asset to the Environmental Commission. He reminded everyone of the "Porchfest" and "Hands Across the Sand" on May 18th. He mentioned a letter received requesting dogs being permitted to be walked on the promenade and requested sandwich board signs be placed at the beachfront promenade as a reminder: "No Dogs Allowed".

Mayor Engelstad stated that the Board of Education has a budget meeting scheduled for May 7th. He continued, it was unfortunate that the Egg Hunt was cancelled twice due to rain.

PUBLIC COMMENT

William Psiuk, 110 Fifth Avenue, thanked Councilman Cotler for making a motion to relist the

resolution authorizing a structural engineer review of the retired sump pump station.

Eileen Shissas, 112 Fourth Avenue, expressed concerns regarding the rehab of the retired sump

pump station and a rent credit for the rehabilitation of the building.

Julie Nutaitis, 605 Fourth Avenue, commented that she was in favor of sandwich boards on the

beachfront promenade.

John Naples, 506B Ocean Avenue, expressed concerns regarding the placement of a food truck

on Brinley Avenue as it will impact the resident's view of the beachfront.

Joe Albanese, 405 ½ Ocean Park Avenue, requested a cost analysis be prepared of the

surrounding rents received for concessions.

Henry Machos, 209 Third Avenue, expressed concerns regarding food trucks being placed in

front of properties as it will impact property values.

Terry Wright, 406 Madison Avenue, stated that he did not understand the discussion regarding

the retired sump pump station as it will benefit the borough. The \$2,500. spent is a drop in the

bucket compared to the revenue that will be generated from the building.

Thomas Coan, 612 Third Avenue, expressed concerns regarding the revenue received from concessions at the beachfront. He expressed further concerns regarding the public's inability to

review the Municipal Access Plan. He requested an informal public meeting anytime the

borough is building or making changes.
