REMINDER: Dog License(s) are due annually. The fee is \$8.20 for spayed/neutered dogs and \$11.20 for non-spayed/non-neutered dogs.

A rabies certificate must be submitted and current with a minimum of 10 months of the licensing year. The Borough's licensing year is January 1st through December 31st.

Licensing must be obtained prior to March 1st or a late fee of \$10.00 will be assessed.

PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCIES

PHASE ONE: All vehicles shall be moved off of the south side of the street from all streets that run east and west.

All vehicles shall be moved off of the east side of the street from all streets that run north and south.

Vehicles shall not be moved back until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and snow has stopped, to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

PHASE TWO: All vehicles shall be moved off of the north side of all streets that run east west and off of the west side of all streets that run north and south. This is to allow for continued plowing when necessary.

For further information please refer to Ord.# 9-11.1 (Temporary no parking for snow removal).

PLACING SNOW OR ICE INTO THE STREET (S) IS PROHIBITED

No person or other entity shall throw, place or deposit any snow or ice into or on any street in the Borough, and no owner, tenant or occupant shall cause or allow such throwing, placing or depositing of any snow or ice to remain in the street, being the intent and purpose of this provision to prohibit all such persons and entities from throwing, placing or depositing snow or ice which accumulated on the private property of adjoining sidewalks into the streets of the Borough.

PLEASE CLEAR FIRE HYDRANTS OF SNOW FOR EMERGENCIES

Emergency Situations:

Examples: Floods, Hurricanes, Blizzards, Etc.

In case of emergency, remember to:

Make A Plan - Know where you will meet and how you will contact family members.

Build A Kit - Have an emergency supply kit containing water, nonperishable food, battery powered radio, flashlight, extra batteries, medication and sanitary supplies.

Emergency Bulletins are broadcast on radio stations WJLK-94.3FM, WOBM-92.7FM and WRAT-95.9FM. Emergency notifications can also be received via phone and/or email by registering for Bradley Beach's Emergency Notification System. This can be done by logging in to www.bradleybeachnj.gov and clicking on "Emergency Notification System" on the Emergency Management link. You may also go to the Bradley Beach Police Department to register.

Be Informed - Know how to receive emergency information in your community.

If you must prepare to evacuate, and time permits, you should secure your home by bringing all outdoor objects that could become projectiles indoors, turn off all utilities, move valuables to higher floors.

Never walk through standing or moving flood water.





Bicycle Safety

Safety Check Bicycle Equipment

- Always inspect your bike prior to riding.
- The seat should be adjusted to the proper height and locked in place
 - Make certain all parts are secure and working properly
 - Check that the tires are inflated properly
- Make sure the bike is equipped with reflectors on the rear, front, pedals and spokes
 - A horn or bell, a rear-view mirror and a bright headlight also are recommended

Plan to Be Seen

- Make certain drivers can see you.
- Wear neon, fluorescent or other bright clothing
 - Whenever possible, ride during the day
- If you must ride at night, wear reflective clothing and use bike lights for visibility.

Wear a Helmet

- Helmets appropriate for bicycling should be worn by everyone adults and children on every bike ride regardless of length of the ride.
 - Helmets are required in New Jersey for cyclists under age 17. More detailed guidelines for helmets can be found NHTSA.gov to properly fit a bicycle helmet: https://www.nhtsa.gov/road-safety/bicycle-safety
 - Adjust sizing pads or fit ring until the helmet is snug
- Position the helmet level on your head, covering the forehead and not tipped backward or forward; this will be about one to two finger widths above the eyebrow
 - Adjust the side straps so they form a "V" shape under and slightly in front of your ears
 - Center the buckle on the chin strap under your chin
 - Buckle and tighten the chin strap until it is snug; no more than one to two fingers should be able to fit between the chin and strap
 - When fitted, the helmet should not rock more than 1 inch side to side or front to back on your head

Follow the Rules of the Road

- Stay safe by following the rules:
- Get acquainted with traffic laws; bicyclists must follow the same rules as motorists
 - Ride single-file in the direction of traffic
- Remain alert, keep your head up and look around; watch for opening car doors and other hazards
 - Use hand signals when turning and use extra care at intersections
 - Before entering traffic, stop and look left, right, left again and over your shoulder

Please remember to always lock up your bicycles when unattended. Thank you.

BULK ITEM INFORMATION

BULK STICKERS are required for items that are not considered regular household garbage. Bulk stickers may be purchased at Borough Hall. Bulk trash with stickers shall only be placed at the curb 12 hours before regulated pickup days and no later than 5:00 am the day of collection. **Limited to 5 items.**

COMPUTER, ELECTRONICS AND METAL require an appointment for curbside pick-up. Contact Borough Hall at 732-776-2999 ext. 1010 to schedule a curbside pick-up. Bulk stickers are required. Items accepted: computer cases, CPU's, keyboards, mice, monitors, scanners, printers, cables, laptops, peripherals, television, radios, telephones, cameras, stereo components, VCR's and DVD players. Bradley Beach residents may bring (bulk stickers required) the above listed items to the Trash/Recycling Lot, 1011 Main Street in Bradley Beach. (Proof of residency required). Curbside pick-up is the second Thursday of every month and is limited to 5 items.



Covered trash containers must be placed curbside no later than 5:00 am the day of collection no earlier than 12 hours before pick-up. Empty trash containers must be removed from curbside within 12 hours of collection. Trash will NOT be picked up on 1/2/23 in recognition of New Year's Day (pick-up will be on 1/3/23 for Zone 3 and 1/5/23 for Zone 1), Thanksgiving Day 11/23/23 (pick-up will be on 1/27/23), Christmas Day 12/25/23 (pick-up will be on 1/2/6/23 for ALL zones) and New Year's Day (1/1/24 (pick-up will be on 1/2/24 for ALL zones). Trash collection MAY be suspended during a Severe Storm or a State of Emergency. Trash collection will resume on the next; regular day of collection.

286-34 BULK STICKER FEES FOR COLLECTION OF BULK GOODS

The following schedule of the number of fee stickers required for each bulk item is based on four fee stickers for 25 pounds of weight. The weight of items used in this schedule are estimated weights formulated by the Department of Public Works. If any item not on this schedule is being placed for collection, the person placing the item should estimate the total weight to the item (in pounds) and divide the figure by 25 to arrive at the number of fee stickers required for that item. Any person unable to estimate the weight of any item may call the Department of Public Works for an estimate.

Below is a list of the most common items placed at curbside for disposal. NOTE: Items weighing less than 25 pounds require four stickers, provided that items weighing more than 25 pounds may be combined and placed together in a bag as long as the bag does not weigh more than 25 pounds. Four stickers must then be placed on the outside of the bag.

BULK PICK-UP AND DROP OFF PRACTICES:

- 1. A Systematic 6-time a year street pick-up with stickers and on a schedule-the second Thursday of every month alternating zones. Maximum 5 items per pick-up.
- 2. Each year a card will be issued to each household for 6 drop-offs per year at the Yard. You can pick-up your card when you make your first drop-off. There is no change to Computer, Electronic and Metal.
- 3. We will issue one other \$50 sticker per household if anyone needs an additional drop. That would be a total of 13 opportunities for bulk disposal.

The goal of the recycling program is to reduce our community's waste by expanding access to recycling options for many materials. The following is how Bradley Beach residents can participate:

RECYCLING: COLLECTION EVERY WEDNESDAY FOR ALL ZONES

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLABLES must be placed into a covered sturdy re-useable container not to exceed 32 gallons with drainage holes in the bottom and placed curbside by 5:00 am the day of collection. ALL cans, bottles and plastics should be washed to control bugs and odors. Please do not put plastic bags in with single stream recycling.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLABLES INCLUDE: glass bottles and jars, cereal and snack boxes, cardboard, office paper, newspaper, magazines, tin, aluminum and steel cans, plastic bottles, and rigid plastics.

PLASTIC & GLASS EXAMPLES: labeled number 1 PET bottles, labeled number 2 HDPE bottles (detergent type bottles), labeled number 5 PP containers such as: margarine tubs, baby wipe containers, yogurt cups, empty K-cup® pods.

METAL CAN EXAMPLES: aluminum cans, tin cans, bi-metal cans, nonhazardous aerosol cans, clean aluminum foil.

PAPER & CARDBOARD EXAMPLES: cardboard and corrugated cardboard shipping boxes, (un-waxed) <u>must</u> be collapsed, pizza boxes, mixed paper [including: chipboard (cereal boxes), white and colored paper, junk mail, magazines, soft-cover books, newspaper (including inserts)] may be folded and tied securely in bundles, maximum size of 2' X 2' or placed with single stream recyclables in containers.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED: motor oil containers, mirrors, bulbs, dishware, ceramics, glassware, window glass, LDPE, plastic wrap, bubble wrap, plastic bags (see plastic film pick-up below), propane tanks, batteries of any kind, Styrofoam (all types), food of any kind, food wrappers or used paper plates, napkins or paper towels, medical waste or needles, broken bottles or any other type of broken glass.

PLASTIC FILM PICK UP

The Borough will provide each household with a "plastic film" recycling bin. Gas Grill Do's And Donts



Always follow all of the grill manufacturer's instructions and keep written materials and manuals in a safe, accessible place.



When not in use, make sure all grill burner controls are turned off and that the valve cylinderis closed.



Make sure the gas grill is shut off and cooled before covering your grill after use.



Always use or store cylinders outdoors with the relief valve in direct contact with the vapor space, usually in an upright (vertical) position.



After filling or exchanging, take your cylinder home immediately. Keep your vehicle ventilated and keep the cylinder valve closed and plugged or capped in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.



When your grill is not in use, cover disconnected hose-end fittings and burner air intakes with small plastic bags, or obtain protective fitting caps from your propane supplier to keep out dirt, insects, and moisture.





Do not smoke while handling the propane cylinder.



Do not allow children to tamper or play with the cylinder or grill.



Do not use, store, or transport your cylinder where it would be exposed to high temperatures. (This includes storing spare cylinders under or near the grill.)

LEAVES, BRUSH & YARD WASTE

Pick-up:

ALL ITEMS MUST BE PLACED AT THE CURB IN SEPARATE PILES. All brush and yard waste shall be placed at curb side by 5:00 am of the day designated for collection. No brush or yard waste shall be placed at the curb side more than 72 hours prior to any scheduled collection.

The Public Works Department starts picking up on the designated Monday and it may take a few days to complete the town. If the Monday falls on a holiday pick-up will be the next working day.

Brush and Shrubs, not more than eight inches in diameter and not in excess of 10 feet in length, may be placed between the curb and sidewalk for collection by the Borough only on days specified for brush collection. All brush placed at any curb must have originated at the property adjacent to the curb at which same is placed for collection.

Brush will be collected on the second and fourth Monday in April and the second Monday in March, May, June, September, October, November and December. The Superintendent of Public Works may add additional brush pick-ups throughout the year, on an as needed basis, please refer to the Borough website at www.bradleybeachnj.gov for updates. The Public Works Department will collect brush as a result of a severe storms throughout the year. Yard waste will be collected on the brush collection dates.

Yard waste materials to be collected by the Borough of Bradley Beach shall be drained of all liquid and then placed at curb side in an authorized yard waste container ONLY. No yard waste loose at the curb will be collected and a summons will be issued for failure to comply.

Leaves may be placed loose or in biodegradable leaf bags at curb side from April 1 through May 31 and from September 15 through December 1st. Leaves shall not be closer than 10 feet to drain inlet. Leaves may be placed for collection only in authorized biodegradable leaf bags.

ALL ITEMS MUST BE PLACED AT THE CURB IN SEPARATE PILES. Please do not combine leaves, dirt or grass clippings with brush or yard waste. Please do not throw brush, leaves, yard waste or grass clippings in the trash.

Definitions:

Authorized Yard Waste Container: Trash or garbage container with approved label and drain holes to allow the water to drain. The container shall not exceed 50 lbs. with contents.

Yard Waste: Hedge/yard trimmings and vegetation from flowers and gardens. Authorized Leaf Bag: Biodegradable leaf bag.

Bradley Beach residents may dispose of brush, shrubs and yard waste at the Trash/Recycling Lot, 1011 Main Street, Bradley Beach (proof of residency required) Please refer to the Borough website at www.bradleybeachnj.gov for days and hours of operation.

GRASS CLIPPINGS WILL NOT be collected by the Borough and SHALL NOT be placed at the curb at any time. The Borough encourages you to participate in the Grass – Cut it and Leave it Program. By doing this you will:

- Save time You don't have to empty your mower's bag, no raking, no bagging, and no taking clippings to the street.
- Use less water lawn clippings contain water and leaving those clippings on the lawn retains moisture, therefore you water less, or not at all.
- Use less fertilizer lawn clippings contain nutrients. Leaving them on the lawn fertilizes your lawn, therefore you use less fertilizer or none at all.

We advise that you Mow High! 2.5" – 3.5" is ideal for NJ. It saves moisture and shades out weeds.

Plan Ahead! If a fire breaks out in your home, you may have only a few minutes to get out safely once the smoke alarm sounds. Everyone needs to know what to do and where to go if there is a fire.

SAFETY TIPS

-))) MAKE a home escape plan. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows. Discuss the plan with everyone in your home.
- NOW at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
-))) HAVE an outside meeting place (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) a safe distance from the home where everyone should meet.
- PRACTICE your home fire drill at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice a year.
-))) PRACTICE using different ways out.
- >>> TEACH children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
-))) CLOSE doors behind you as you leave.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

-))) If the smoke alarm sounds, GET OUT AND STAY OUT. Never go back inside for people or pets.
- If you have to escape through smoke, GET LOW AND GO under the smoke to your way out.
-))) CALL the fire department from outside your home.

- Install smoke, heat, and fire. Install smoke alarms inside every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- According to an NFPA survey, only one of every three
 American households have actually developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.
- While 71% of Americans have an escape plan in case of a fire, only 47% of those have practiced it.
- One-third of American households who made an estimate thought they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life-threatening. The time available is often less. And only 8% said their first thought on hearing a smoke alarm would be to getout!

CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY

No person shall occupy, rent, lease, sell, transfer title or permit the occupancy, letting or sale, or allow any person to live in or upon or inhabit as a tenant or occupant or to occupy as any new owner or co-tenant or co-owner any dwelling house or dwelling unit or any portion of a premises occupied for a separate and distinct commercial use within the confines of the Borough unless such person first obtains from the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough a Certificate of Continued Occupancy and permit authorizing any of the foregoing and when any of the foregoing shall take place.

The Certificate of Continued Occupancy for residential rental units shall be for a term of three years or until the change of ownership of the property or a change in the tenant of the property, whichever event is sooner.

FLOOD INFORMATION

Anywhere it rains, it can flood. A flood is a general and temporary condition where two or more acres of normally dry land or two or more properties are inundated by water or mud flow. Many conditions can result in a flood: hurricanes, overtopped levees, outdated or clogged drainage systems and rapid accumulation of rainfall. Just because you haven't experienced a flood in the past, doesn't mean you won't in the future. Flood risk is not just based on history, it's also based on several factors: rainfall, river-flow, tidal-surge data, topography, flood-control measures, and changes due to building and development.

Flood-hazard maps have been created by the federal government to show different degrees of risk for your community, which help determine the cost of flood insurance. The lower the degree of risk, the lower the flood insurance premium. Homeowners Insurance does not provide coverage for floods. A separate policy must be obtained. The federal government offers such policies. See below.

HOW CAN I TELL IF MY HOME IS IN THE FLOOD ZONE?

The Borough of Bradley Beach is mainly not in the flood zone. Small sections of land near Sylvan Lake and Fletcher Lake are in the flood zone. To determine your zone, you can contact Borough Hall, or go to the Borough website www.bradleybeachnj.gov and click the link to FEMA or onto the website: www.fema.gov and click on maps, then flood map online and enter address.

IF FLOOD INSURANCE IS NEEDED, PLEASE SEE THE BELOW INFORMATION:

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which works closely with nearly 90 private insurance companies to offer flood insurance to property owners and renters. In order to qualify for flood insurance, a community must join the NFIP and agree to enforce sound floodplain management standards. The Borough of Bradley Beach is a NFIP member. The NFIP, a federal program, offers flood insurance, which can be purchased through property and casualty insurance agents. Rates are set and do not differ from company to company or agent to agent. These rates depend on many factors, which include the date and type of construction of your home, along with your buildings level of risk.

DRIVING FLOOD FACTS: The following are important points to remember when driving in flood conditions:

- Six inches of water will reach the bottom of most passenger cars causing loss of control and possible stalling.
- A foot of water will float many vehicles.
- Two feet of rushing water can carry away most vehicles including sport utility vehicles (SUV's) and pick-ups.

AFTER A FLOOD: The following are guidelines for the period following a flood:

- Listen for news reports to learn whether the community's water supply is safe to drink.
- Avoid floodwaters; water may be contaminated by oil, gasoline, or raw sewage. Water may also be electrically charged from underground or downed lines.
- Be aware of areas where floodwaters have receded. Roads may have weakened and could collapse under the weight of a car.
- Stay away from downed power lines and report them to the power company.
- Return home only when authorities indicate it is safe.
- Use extreme caution when entering buildings; there may be hidden damage, particularly infoundations.
- Service damaged septic tanks, cesspools, pits, and leaching systems as soon as possible. Damaged sewage systems are serious health hazards.
- Clean and disinfect everything that got wet. Mud left from floodwater can contain sewage and chemicals.
